The CT Library Association, which was founded in 1891, just a couple of years before the Mystic & Noank Library, held its 2026 annual conference April 27 through April 29 at the Mystic Marriott.

The CT Library Association is Connecticut's professional organization of librarians, library staff, friends, and trustees working together to improve library service to Connecticut, to advance the interests of librarians, library staff, and librarianship, and to increase public awareness of libraries and library services.

Each year at the annual conference, CLA honors librarians who have distinguished themselves in their professional life. This year, Katherine Trejo-Thorp nominated Roberta Donahue to receive the prestigious **Supporter of Support Staff Award**, which honors a library administrator or manager who promotes the role of library assistants and support staff.

Anyone who knows Roberta at all knows that she does not seek the limelight. Roberta doesn't do the excellent work she does, and has done for forty years, so that she can get an award. Roberta is not only a leader in the field of Public Library Services for Youth; she is also an

outstanding Administrator. Roberta's job description says that she strategizes, plans, and oversees all Library operations (including the chicks and guinea pigs!). She does it all: information technology, the Library's website and social media presence, personnel, volunteers, outreach to area schools and local organizations that serve youth. Roberta develops the budget and sees to it that operations' expenditures stay within that budget. She works with the contractors on whom we rely to maintain our building and grounds.

Yes, Roberta is the **Supporter of the Support Staff**, but she supports us all, every day, including Saturday and Sunday!

MNL Friends Outreach to StoneRidge Senior Living Community



In November of 2004, my parents moved into the recently opened buildings at StoneRidge. There was a lovely library near the entrance, and a welcoming Library Committee was set up shortly thereafter. A 20-year relationship commenced between StoneRidge and the Mystic & Noank Library, with a rotating collection of books brought over 4 times a year for the readers at StoneRidge.



shelves at the StoneRidge Library is great fun because I collaborate with a resident who has become a wonderful friend. She takes time to examine each tome, and we discuss why it was selected (cover, size, and content all matter!). This often leads us to continue our conversation at lunch in the dining room.

The number of people who eagerly await the new arrivals often start pacing as we finish up, and then the check-outs begin. In 3 months, there are over 200 check-outs of the collection and so many happy readers who appreciate this service.

This process involves a lot of thought as there are all sorts of readers in a community with such varied tastes and interests. Picking out 80 -100 books takes time: to select a variety of large and regular print, mysteries, action, romance, biographies, non-fiction in several categories, while also considering the level of blood and guts, language, and, ahem, degree of romance depicted, is quite a balancing act.

The StoneRidge Library itself has an amazing collection of books that has been added to and maintained by the Library Committee, and there are many donations of brand new books when readers can't wait for a Library copy to be available.



Sometimes readers give me suggestions about what they would like, such as an author, a particular series, or a topic, which makes things easier. It also requires a system so the same books are not brought over again for 3 years. Collecting the last rotation of books and checking them back in, checking the new rotation out, and carrying milk crates of carefully packed books back and forth is a great form of physical exercise!

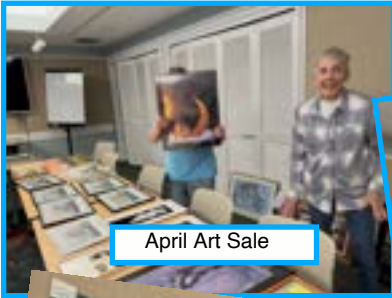
